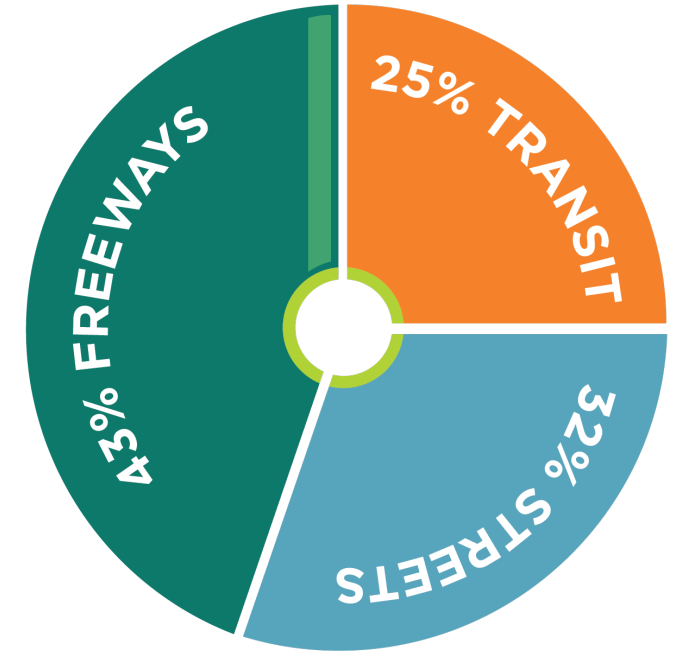


Measure M2 Ten-Year Review Update

Background

- Measure M2 (M2) approved in 2006 with strong voter support
- Governed by Ordinance No. 3 and the Transportation Investment Plan (Plan)
- Ordinance requires a ten-year comprehensive review to ensure accountability
- First review in 2015 confirmed progress, public support, and led to funding adjustments for transit programs



ENVIRONMENTAL

-  A total of 5% of Measure M Freeway Program funds is allocated to the Freeway Environmental Mitigation Program
-  A total of 2% of the overall Measure M Program funds is allocated to the Environmental Cleanup Program

Measure M2 (M2) is a 30-year, half-cent sales tax for transportation improvements in Orange County, administered by the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA). M2 includes a Transportation Investment Plan (Plan) that funds a range of improvements—enhancing freeways, local streets and public transit, while also addressing environmental mitigation and sustainability. With an estimated \$14 billion in funding by 2041, M2 plays a central role in the development of Orange County's transportation system.

In accordance with taxpayer safeguards, OCTA is conducting a Comprehensive Ten-Year Review (Review) to evaluate the performance of the Plan. The Review ensures that M2 remains transparent, accountable and responsive to Orange County's evolving transportation needs.
